Students from classes 3-8 filled up the form and the following students were shortlisted by the UnMath team.

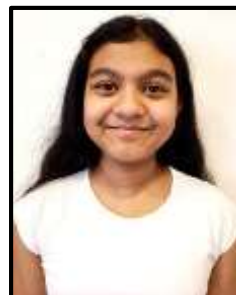

The topic for the debate was **Application of Math in Packaged drinks.**

Team A was allotted Tetra Packs as its topic, Team B spoke on Cans; Team C was allotted Bisleri Bottles as its topic and Team D spoke on Packaged cold drink bottles. They had to research and prepare a 4 min speech on their allotted topic and had to give convincing answers to the questions posed by the Judge and members of the other teams. The shortlisted students had to attend a dry run (10-15 minutes) 2 days prior to the event where they were briefed about the flow of the program to ensure the smooth functioning of the debate. On the day of the event the students spoke about the statistical aspects, geometrical relevance, ratios, percentage etc. They answered the questions posed to them with eloquence.

On the basis of their speech and the Mystery box points, **Team D comprising of Ishita De and Shubh Bansal were declared the winners** of the debate and have now qualified for the Inter School Debate from where they will go for the country competition and then the international one. It was a nail-biting finish as each team was just 0.5 marks behind their opponents.

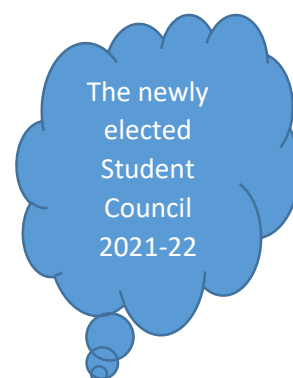

ICT DEPT. ZOOMS ITS WAY TO GLORY

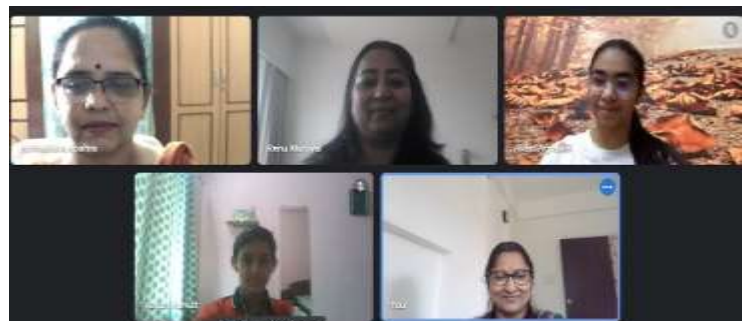

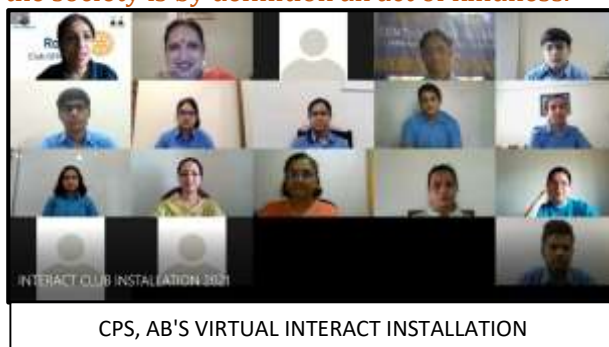

The young achievers were applauded by the school management and staff for their wonderful performance.



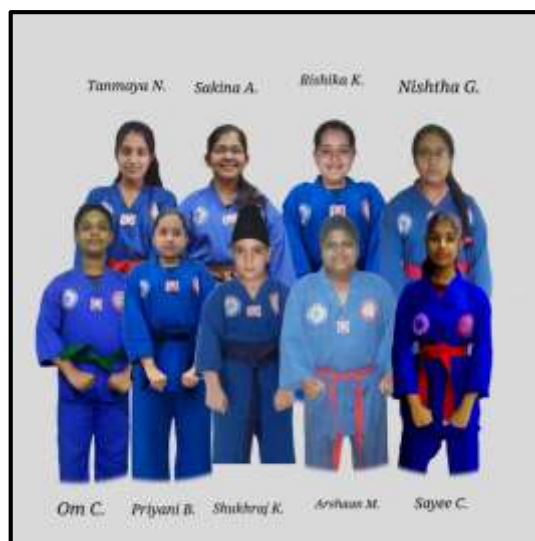
CPS AB LEAPS FOR THE NATIONAL SQAY CHAMPIONSHIP 2020-21

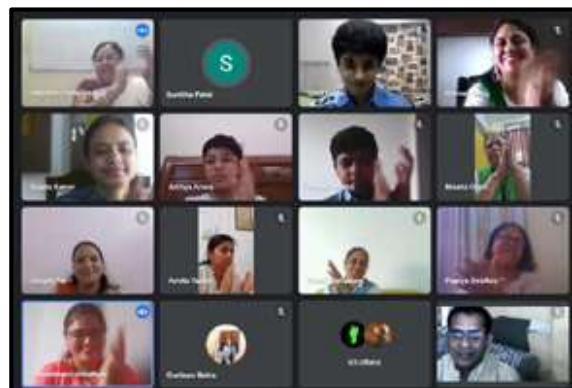

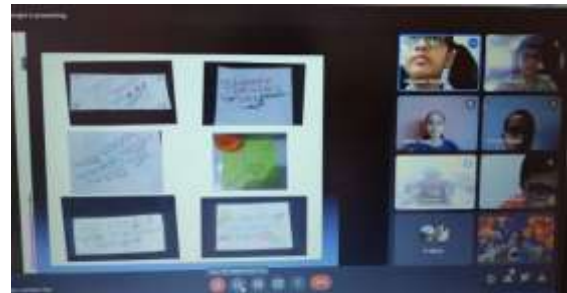

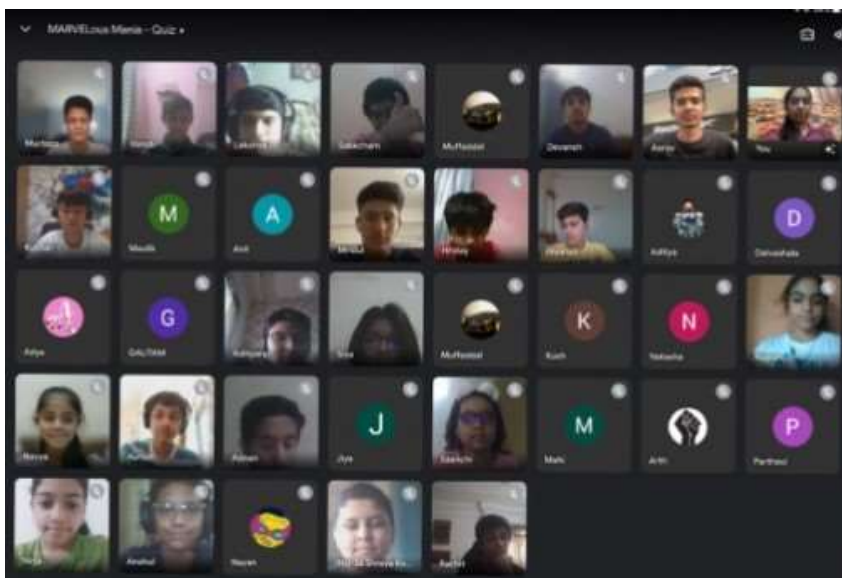
CPSWN INTERACT CLUB ORGANIZES INNOVATIVE FUNDRAISER
