
It has rightly been said 'Every success story is a tale of constant adaption, revision and change.' It is this change that has always prompted

## CLASS: 2A

#### PROJECT TOPIC: MILK

#### CLASS TEACHER: ADITI PADMAWAR

The children of class 2A, suggested many topics for the project, but in the end, voting was done and the topic Milk was selected. The young minds had many questions regarding milk as to why it is called a balanced diet, and so on. So different activities related to the topic were

CLASS TEACHER: GHAOSIA FARHEEN HAKIMI Class 2B, after lot of discussions and suggestions came up with topic "Neem" for the project. As Neem is present naturally around us in abundance, so we wanted to explore it. It started with a field trip to Neem Foundation, which is present in village Gondkhairi on Amravati road. Over there, the director of neem Foundation, Mr.



Laxmikant Padole explained the various benefits of different parts of neem tree and how it is actually beneficial to the mankind and also explained the process of extraction of neem oil and its various benefits. With that knowledge, we started our activities that was to make Neem based soap, made Neem pesticides. We studied about the uses of dry Neem leaves in storing food grains, old books and clothes. Through this project, children learnt the importance of Neem and its medicinal properties. It's uses and benefits of making home made products such as soap. Children said that the papers were being cut very easily like a piece of cake. Children experienced how their worksheets were printed on a legal size paper by visiting our school printing room. 




